The Idea came from A Tatter's Workbook, a reproduction of an unknown persons 1920s notebook

Equipment; Two Tatting shuttle , Thread White Cebelia DMC No #30

Abbreviations - small picot -- medium picot(s) --- $\frac{1}{2}$ inch picot + join(s) DNRW do not reverse work cl close T turn work , SShs switch shuttles TOR Thrown Off or floating ring, [ILR] In line Ring

Instructions; the outer row is done first then the Inner center row.

Outside Row

Beginning with the large cloverleaf

Ring 1; 15 -- 2 --7-- 6-- cl. DNRW

Ring 2; 6 + to last 3 - -3 -- 6 cl. DNRW

SCMR Center Ring 3; 6 + 9 SShs (TOR 3- - 3 cl.) SShs 9 - - 6 cl. DNRW

Ring 4; 6 + 3 - - 3 - - 6, cl. DNRW

Ring 5; 6 + 7 - - 2 - - 15 cl. T.

Ch 9 SShs [ILR 1] R 2-2 cl SSh ch 6 SSh [ILR 2] R 2-1-1 cl SSh ch 6 SSh R 6 cl SSh ch 9

** Small cloverleaf:

Ring 6; 6 + to last p of Ring 5 , 2 + to the next to last picot 3-3 cl.

Ring 7; 3 + 6 - - 6 - - 3 cl.

Ring 8; 3 + 3 - - 2- - 6 cl. Turn.

Ch 9 SShs R 6 cl. SSh ch 6 SSh[ILR 2] R 1-1-2 SSh ch 6 SShs [ILR 1] R 2-2 cl SSh ch 9

Large cloverleaf

Ring 1; 15 + 2 + 7- - 6 cl.

Ring 2; 6 + to last picot 3 - - 3 - - 6 cl.

SCMR Center Ring 3; 6 + 9 SShs (TOR 3-3 cl.) SShs 9 - - 6 cl. DNRW

Ring 4; 6 + 3ds - - 3 - - 6 cl.

Ring 5; 6 + 7 - - 2 - - 15 cl.

Ch 9 + ch 6 +ch 6 SSh R 6 cl SSh ch 9**

**Repeat from 4 times = total 6 Large Cloverleaves

Inner Row

these are long picot

Center

Ring 1; 4--2--2--2 +(ILR2) 2--2--2--4 cl. Rw Ch 4----2----4 RW

Ring 2; 4--2--2--2 +(ILR2) 2--2--2--4 cl. Rw Ch 4----2----4 RW

Ring 3; 4--2--2--2 +(ILR2) 2--2--2--4 cl. Rw Ch 4 + (2nd picot of 1st chain) 2----4

Ring 4; 4--2--2--2 +(ILR2) 2--2--2--4 cl. Rw Ch 4 + (2nd picot of 2nd chain) 2 ----4

Ring 5; 4--2--2--2 +(ILR2) 2--2--2--4 cl. Rw Ch 4 + (2nd picot of 3rd chain) 2 + (1st picot of 1st chain) 4

Ring 6; 4--2--2--2 +(ILR 2)2--2--2--4 cl. Rw Ch 4+(2nd picot of 4th chain) 2 + (1st picot of 2nd chain 4
join to Ring . C&T
